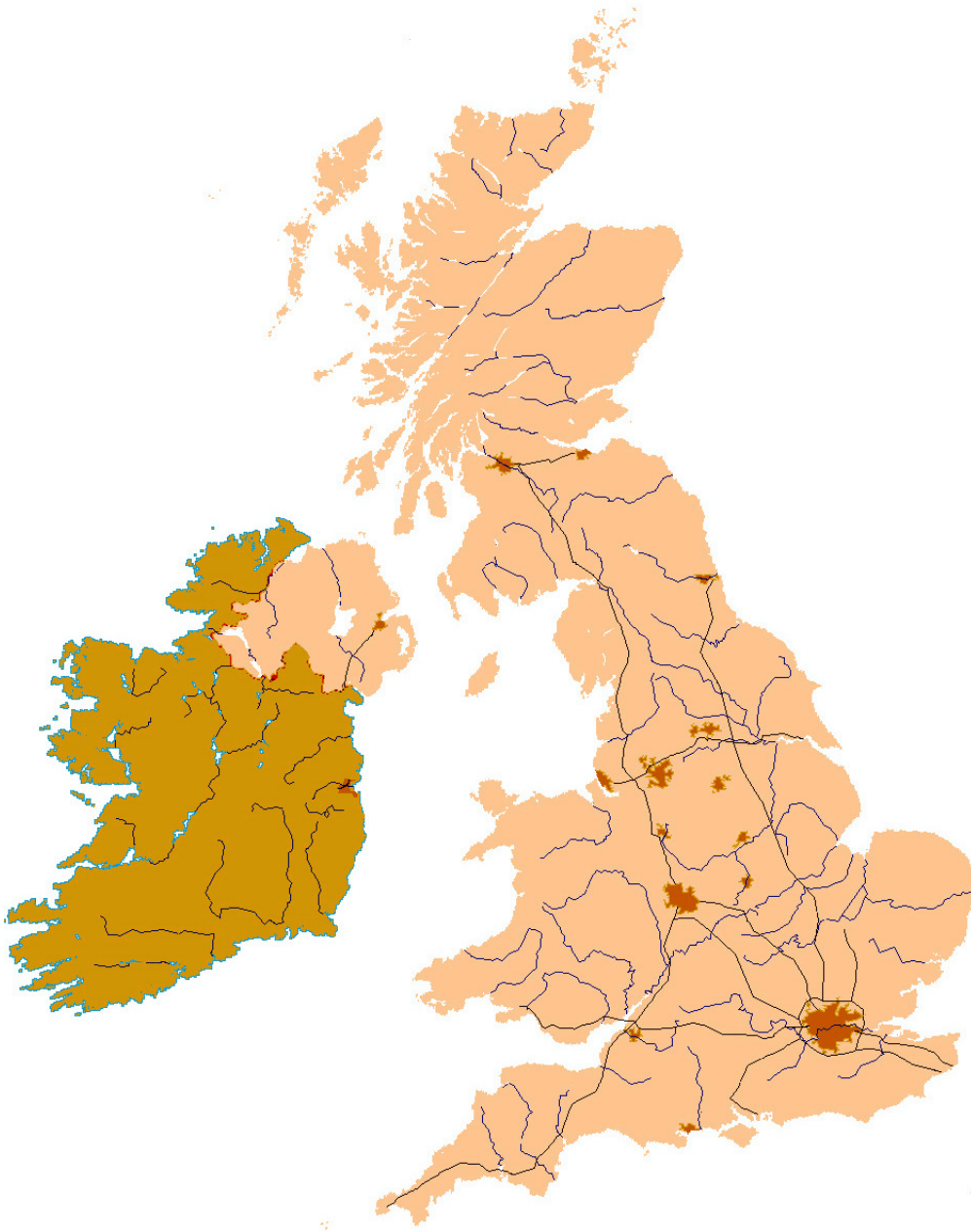

The island next to Britain is called Ireland.

It stands for ‘United Kingdom’.

The ‘United Kingdom’ consists of England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.

Wales and England have had one parliament for about 500 years.
8. Since when has Wales not been independent?
Wales has not been independent since 1282.
9. Since when have Scotland and England had one parliament?
Scotland and England have had the same parliament since 1707 (for almost 300 years).
10. What’s the smallest part of the UK?
The smallest part of the UK is Northern Ireland.
11. What country is not part of the UK?
The Republic of Ireland is not part of the UK.
12. Since when has it been independent?
It has been an independent country since 1921.
