5. What happens to Frankenstein's father as a result of this latest tragedy?  
*He dies of grief.*
6. What is the magistrate's response when Frankenstein tells him the entire story of the creature?  
*The magistrate believes him, but says that he doesn't think he and his men will be successful in catching the creature.*
7. What does Frankenstein do after he leaves the magistrate?  
*He decides to pursue the monster and kill him.*
8. What request does Frankenstein make of Robert Walton?  
*Frankenstein knows his strength is failing. He asks Robert Walton to destroy the creature if he ever has the opportunity.*
9. What happens to Frankenstein?  
*He dies of natural causes while in the cabin on the ship.*
10. What happens to the creature?  
*He comes into the cabin and sees the dead Frankenstein. He tells Walton that he is going to travel in the far north and kill himself. We last see the creature as he floats away into the darkness on an ice raft.*
